Cross Country Results: Inter-county Championships.

The annual UK Inter-county CC Championships moved to Birmingham from Nottingham this year on 13th March. Cheshire finished teams in all of the age groups and in all except 2 of the 10 races, Cheshire teams finished in the top half of the 40+ teams.

The senior men's team was 12th led home by Matt Barnes (Altrincham) in 25th place. The U20 team were led home by Matt Jackson (Warrington) who gained selection to represent England in the revived Home Countries international at the end of the month. Tom Jervis (50th), Zach Bamber (57th) and Elliott Bowker (22nd) led home their respective age group teams of U17, U15 and U13s. Gemma Connolly (Sutton St Helens) was first Cheshire senior lady, finishing 96th, while Rebecca Craigie (Vale Royal), recovered from injury in the National CC two weeks earlier which caused a dnf, ran exceptionally well to finish 10th in the U20 race to lead the Cheshire team home to 4th place. Megan Huxley (Vale Royal) in 6th place led the U17 team home to 11th position: Shannon Johnston 16th the Under 15 team (6th) and Jessica Parsons 9th the under 13 team (16th). The county's thanks go to the team managers: Adrian Thiemicke (seniors); Marcus Walker (U20 and 17 males); Julie/Phil Hicken (U20 and 17 females); Chris Griffiths (U15 and U13 boys); Bob/Pauline Lynch (U15 and 13 girls). Mike Cutler, the new County Chairman, master minded the travel arrangements of the now traditional double decker coach (and had sufficient energy left to run the Stafford 20 mile road race the next day!). These championships are one of the few occasions that Cheshire athletes compete as county teams.

One week later was another occasion although for the schools (when age groups are one year different from the "clubs" event):

The English Schools' Cross-Country Championships - on 20 March, around 4000 young athletes competed in wet and muddy conditions at Heaton Park, Manchester. The course was demanding to say the least, with a sixty degree slope thrown in for good measure. Harry Ellis was crowned Senior Boys' Champion after a fine run, finishing six seconds ahead of the second-placed runner (and was pictured on the cover of Athletics Weekly). The senior boys' team of Harry, backed by by A Clewes, L Hilton, E Crowther, D Jackson, A Perry, C Bennett and P Beesley finished in 23rd position R Craigie was highest-placed finisher in the senior girls' squad in fourth (and also pictured in Athletics Weekly) , with some strong performances from team mates R Jefferson, N Meadows, K Stringer, S Griffiths, R Hetherington and G Mayled to ensure a top ten team finish in 9th - the best from any of the Cheshire teams. Also in excellent form were the inter-girls, finishing in 13th spot led home by M Huxley in tenth place. The rest of the team were T McCormick, D Wallis, A Pettitt, L Gray, L Bunce, E Heaven and K Ashcroft. The inter-boys' team of Z Bamber, L Renton, B Edwards, R Owen, H Valentine, C Goodwin and C Murray also achieved a top twenty finish. The junior boys' squad of D Gant, L Burthem, R Poole, M Roston, R jones, K Acton and L Cockerton were in 23rd position, whilst, last but not least, the junior girls' team led home by C Jarvis and backed up by J Parsons, J Evans, E Carter, G Pickles, A Brooks and L Towers finished in 22nd position in what was a very large field. Well done to everyone who took part in a challenging series of races representing Cheshire Schools where the 3 girls age groups combined to put Cheshire 2nd in Group B (based on population size).

Malta International – the following Cheshire athletes will be part of the Northern team travelling to Malta – Samantha Fraser-Sadler, James Gladman, Matthew Jackson and Sam Dykes.

Congratulations to Alex Wort of Warrington who was placed 1st in the North and 5th overall in the England Athletics combined events championships held at Sheffield on 6-7 March. Competing in the U17 mens' heptathon Alex's points total of 3615 included 5 new pbs, including six seconds off his previous best time in the 1000m, where a fine display of front running helped to bring him the title. Also competing at Sheffield were Victoria Anderson and Alice Jennings of West Cheshire, who were taking part in the U17 womens' Pentathlon. Victoria was 1st in the North and 2nd overall, whilst Alice was 5th in the North and 6th overall.

Cheshire athlete **Allyn Condon** was a member of the GB Bobsleigh team during the Winter Olympics becoming one of the few individuals to take part in both Winter and Summer Olympics.

Cheshire qualified athlete, **Hayley Jones** (Wigan Phoenix), was selected as member for the Women's 4x400m relay team at the World Indoor Championships, Doha. Hayley had come back into good form this year after a considerable period of injury.

Stevie Stockton (Vale Royal) was selected for the senior UK Womens team for the International CC championships in Poland on 28th March.

Matt Jackson (Warrington AC) ran for the England Junior Mens team in the Home Countries International at Mansfield on 28th March

More success came recently for CNAC athletes **Liam Clowes** and **Josh Platt** at the NIA Birmingham. Liam stormed to win gold in the 200m with a new pb which puts him top of the UK rankings. Josh picked up two bronze medals in the U15 boys 60m and the 200m events. Josh's times put him into the UK rankings in 3^{rd} and 2^{nd} positions respectively.

Darren Scott (Trafford) has had a busy winter a setting a number of indoor records at 200 and 300m in the MV40 age group.

Joe Shellhorn who has been the main point of contact for Cheshire officials for the past 15 years is retiring from his post. For a short period, Alan Morris, who will be taking over the position will be working in tandem with Joe. Joe would like to remind officials to send in their returns for this year's Cheshire events – preferably by end-March. This is not the last we shall see of Joe, as he is taking over from George Bunner as President on the Cheshire County Committee. The County owes Joe a vote of thanks for all his hard work over the past years, whilst Joe, in his turn, thanks everyone for all their help and encouragement during his time in post.

The Cheshire Network Action Group has been formed to promote discussion between Clubs with a view to sharing ideas, best practice and initiatives for a host of activities. It has been initiated by an Athletics Network bid to England Athletics for significant funding but the clubs currently involved are keen to include as many Cheshire Clubs as possible. Minutes of the meeting held at the end of February are on the County website. The focus of the meeting was the first event and alternatives were discussed from a major headline event to a round robin of vents. A large headline event was fine to make an impact there were concerns about follow up, whereas smaller, clubbased events could increase participation without the need for immediate additional infrastructure. Also discussed were issues about student participation, attracting volunteers and forming schools and university partnerships, Cheshire were told that their bid for funding had been successful and hey were asked us to consider how the funding would be managed. Options include creating a formally constituted body from the Clubs or linking with another organisation, e.g. County Sports Partnership, who could manage the funding on our behalf. We need to ensure that any employed staff member is in post to deliver and not 'push paper', it's vital that the network drives the priorities.
