

Cheshire Network Action Group Meeting No 10 29/09/10

Action Review:

Action 7.3–Each host club (Macclesfield, Warrington AC, Vale Royal, West Cheshire and Crewe and Nantwich) is to confirm commitment, identify potential dates, and particularly identify any short falls in skills or officials that the Coordinator will need to seek from other network clubs, or the EA. This action is now closed. West Cheshire have offered to host the 2nd event on 20th November. Further events are not yet planned.

Actions 8.1, 8.2, 8.3, 8.4 are all complete.

Action 8.5 – VH to make a proposal for organising local, cost-effective coaching, CRB or first-aid courses – ongoing. Merseyside have allocated some funding to coaching. A first aid/ Mentoring course could cost ~£500. It was agreed that a 'First response' course for lots of members is better than a fully accredited course for a few. It may be sensible to incorporate such training into a future Development day.

Network Structure:

- Vicky showed a diagram of the Merseyside Network organisation. It was agreed that we need to move to more formal roles, but treasurer and secretary roles are not necessary yet. The Volunteer Network Coordinator role (Andy's) is to be re-titled Chairperson.
- More professional meetings may attract clubs to attend. It was agreed to try a room at Moss Farm Northwich for the next meeting, and we may try other locations around the County.
- It was agreed that each meeting should major on a 'theme' from the submission (e.g. How to market the network, Induction, Club strategy/ business planning, linking with schools)
- We need to publicize ourselves more to attract more members, and where possible share ideas and events with Merseyside. The Cheshire Clubs Handbook, last published in 2001 would be useful in an appropriate form. Current Club information has been collated by Mike Lamb for the County which could be the basis of an updated handbook.

Action 10.1 – Vicky to contact Mike Lamb and if acceptable to CCAA, work with him to develop a handbook for printing or downloading.

Budget and Work Plan:

Vicky has reconciled our commitments against the budget plan in the network plan. £5885.25 is available to spend to the end of March against the identified activities. Vicky has produced a draft forecast and budget against allocated items. The priority is identified in the submission. Sarah reminded us that any unspent funds will be returned to EA at the end of the year.

Action 10.2 – All to review Vicky's forecast spend proposal (VH to send out electronic copy) by 8/10/10. The process of agreeing spends + paying expenses was discussed. Approval will be by one member and Vicky.

Action 10.3 - Vicky to produce a draft network expenses form compatible with CWSP procedures.

Camera

It was agreed that a camera should be purchased for the network for events and technical support. Discount is available for Casio cameras from EA. A balance needs to be made between compact convenience and facilities. Reports and photographs can then be made available to all network clubs as well as EA.

Action 10.4 - Vicky to review cameras and make a proposal (Max £175 inc VAT)
